Commodore Cheryl Pettersen called the meeting to order at 10:36am. **Minutes**: The minutes from the Quarterly Membership Meeting of September 4, 2021, as published in *The Hatter*, were approved as written. **Installation of Officers**: The following officers for 2021-2022 were installed by Past Commodores Dennis Dearing and
